Important Notes

There will be a Grand Feature Parade on Saturday regardless of weather conditions. There will be an estimated 100,000 spectators lining the parade route and an additional 450,000 viewers by our live television broadcast.

All bands which will be eating meals in Buckhannon are asked to eat together as one unit. This will make it easier for both the organizations serving the food as well as the band directors or boosters paying for meals.

All bands should report to the Festival Headquarters on Main Street upon arrival to the festival city. Please be sure you have advised the band coordinators of your arrival time. All buses should take the Buckhannon / Route 20 exit off Route 33 – Robert C. Byrd Highway.

Escorts will meet bands throughout the week. These escorts will be briefed on your particular band and its schedule prior to your arrival. Therefore they should be able to answer most questions the band might have.

KEEP WITH YOUR SCHEDULE!!! If your band is scheduled for a certain event, your band is expected to be there.

It is important to carefully check all parade, concert, jazz, and field exhibition rules in order to guarantee that you will not be in violation during your competitions.

Please note that all units must continue to march and not stop for performances during the Grand Feature Parade. Failure to comply with this rule will result in **automatic disqualification.**

Awards will be awarded at the Upshur County Courthouse, approximately one (1) hour following the completion of the Junior Royalty Parade and at Wesley Chapel on the campus of WV Wesleyan College after the Grand Feature Parade. Each band is expected to have a representative present to accept their awards.



Parade Times are as follows:

Thursday 6:30 p.m. – Junior Royalty Parade
Friday 6:30 p.m. – Fireman’s Parade
Saturday 1:00 p.m. – Grand Feature Parade

Medical Permits should be carried in all parades.

If possible, all bands participating in the Grand Feature Parade should try to arrive in Buckhannon on Saturday morning by no later than 10:00 a.m.

Upon check-in at the Festival Headquarters all bands will be given bus numbers and parking locations. Parking location will announced at a later date.

YOUR BAND ESCORT WILL DIRECT YOU TO YOUR DESIGNATED PARKING AREA!

A final schedule will be mailed to your band prior to festival week.

Bus parking area numbers will also be mailed and must be placed in the front window of each bus.

We provide advanced emergency care with EMT's and Paramedics staffing our units. You are welcome to stop by the Emergency Squad Headquarters on the corner of Pocahontas and Preston Street in Buckhannon.

During the Strawberry Festival, Emergency first aid stations will be set up in strategic areas along the parade route during the Grand Feature Parade on Saturday.

Due to the length of the parade and the time of year, most of our patient care is heat related. Remember not to eat a great deal of food and try to stay away from sweet drinks while marching. Also, due to the age of the band students, parent consent forms will be needed to treat and transport.

WV Strawberry Festival Parade Policies Form

I/we agree to meet the following standards and requirements set by the WV Strawberry Festival. Should these requirements not be met to the satisfaction of the Parade Committee, I/we understand that the Committee reserves the right to withdraw acceptance of the unit at any time up to AND including the day of the Parade.

1. I/we accept that all audio-visual equipment and transportation used during the parade (i.e., vehicles, golf carts, etc.) will be fully concealed and / or decorated to be aesthetically appealing to spectators. I/we agree that no other vehicles (e.g., supply trucks, dignitary cars) will accompany our group down the Parade route. Any trucks, vehicles, etc. that are determined to not be properly decorated by the parade Committee up to and including the day of the Parade, will not be allowed on the route.
2. The specialty / auxiliary unit will NOT interrupt the flow of the Parade. If the unit does not move at a steady pace down the route an Official Festival Representative has the authority to remove the unit from the Parade.
3. Persons not performing with the group, shall not march behind the band and may walk on the sidewalks along the parade route. Approval by the Parade Committee may be granted for extenuating circumstances that would warrant persons marching behind the band.
4. I/we will carry appropriate banners or signage to identify your unit. (NOTE: Signage should be professionally prepared and large enough for the television and live audiences to read easily.)
5. I/we will arrive at the Parade staging area at the designated time. (NOTE: Specific staging time and instructions will be mailed to all units.)
6. I/we will sign and return the information packages pertaining to our participation in this year's WV Strawberry Festival. (NOTE: The information will be used for advertising and television coverage purposes.)

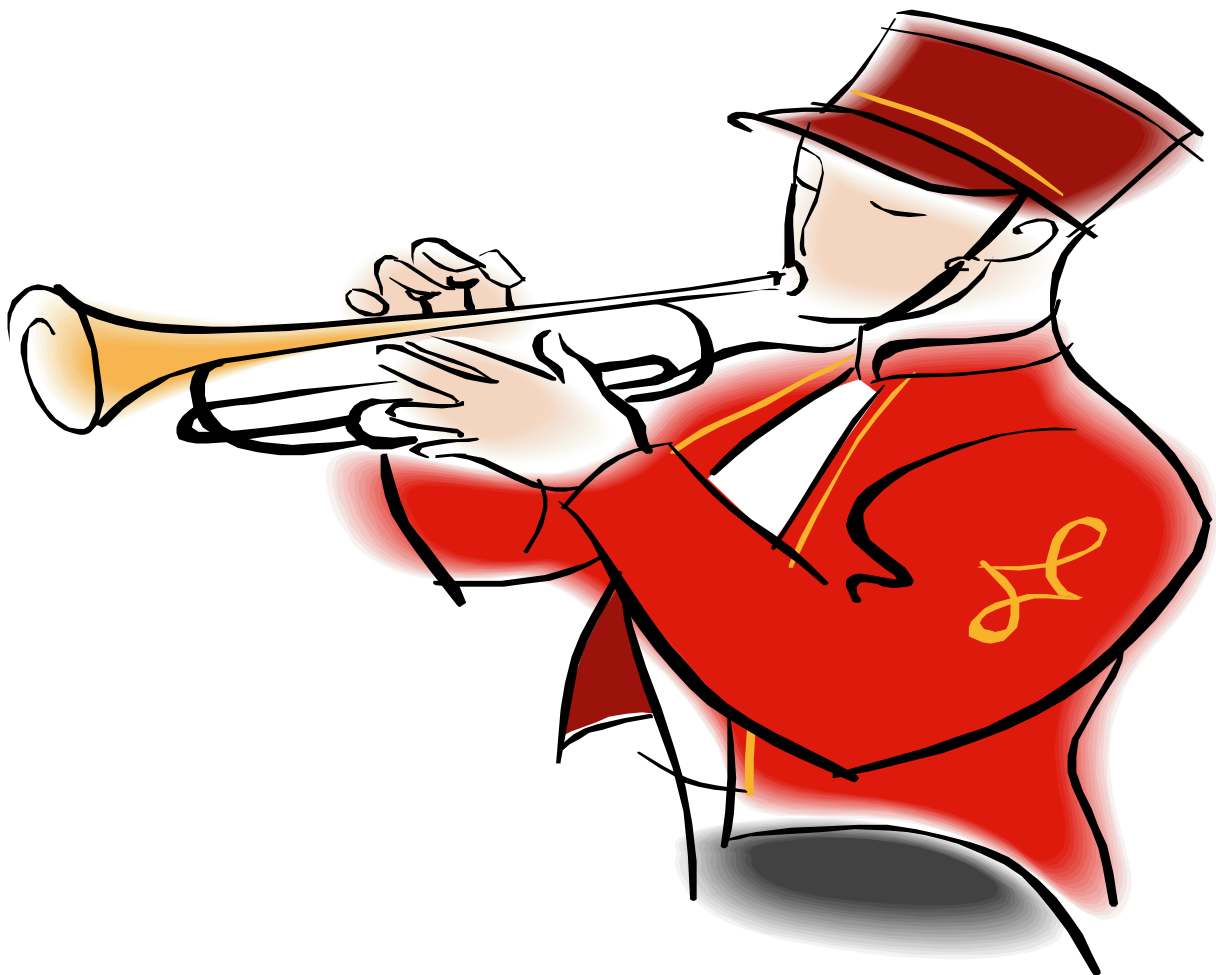

PARADE ROUTE for each parade is the same. The length of the route is 2.5 miles. (See attached guide)

ASSEMBLY for each parade will be on Camden Avenue between Marion Street and West Virginia Wesleyan College ready to step onto Marion Street for the start of marching.

Assembly times are as follows:

- Junior Royalty Parade: 6:00 p.m.
- Fireman's Parade: 6:00 p.m.
- Grand Feature Parade: First Division – 12:00 noon, Second Division – 12:30 p.m., Third Division – 1:00 p.m., Fourth Division – 1:30 p.m.

THE PACE for each band should maintain forward motion at all times. **No band shall delay the forward progress of any of the parades in order to give a concert or any theatrical or military production.

CLASSIFICATION of bands for adjudication purposes will be as follows:

- Class "B: - Junior High School or Middle School Bands
- Class "A" – High School Bands with no more than 55 wind and percussion instrumentalists
- Class "AA" - High School Bands with not over 89 wind and percussion instrumentalists
- Class "AAA" – High School Bands with any number of wind and percussion instrumentalists 90 and above.

RESULTS of adjudication will be available on Thursday evening following the Junior Royalty Parade at the Upshur County Court House. Results and Awards for the Grand Feature Parade will be available at the awards presentation Saturday afternoon at Wesley Chapel.

NOTE: In the event of any clerical errors, the tabulator's sheet used at the Judge's Stand will be the final authority.



ADJUDICATION of bands will take place for the Junior Royalty Parade on Thursday and the Grand Feature Parade on Saturday. Only Junior High School Bands and Middle School Bands will be adjudicated on Thursday evening. All bands will be judged on Saturday.

JUDGES: A minimum of three (3) judges, all of whom shall be qualified to judge at the high school level or above, shall be employed by the West Virginia Strawberry Festival Association for the purpose of determining the awarding of prizes based on the performances of participating high school bands in the Grand Feature Parade. Judges decisions are final and not subject to change by any other officials.

JUDGING CATEGORIES are as follows:

- A) Overall band performance (music, marching, and appearance)
- B) Auxiliaries including twirling, flags, rifles, drum majors, majorettes and pom-poms.

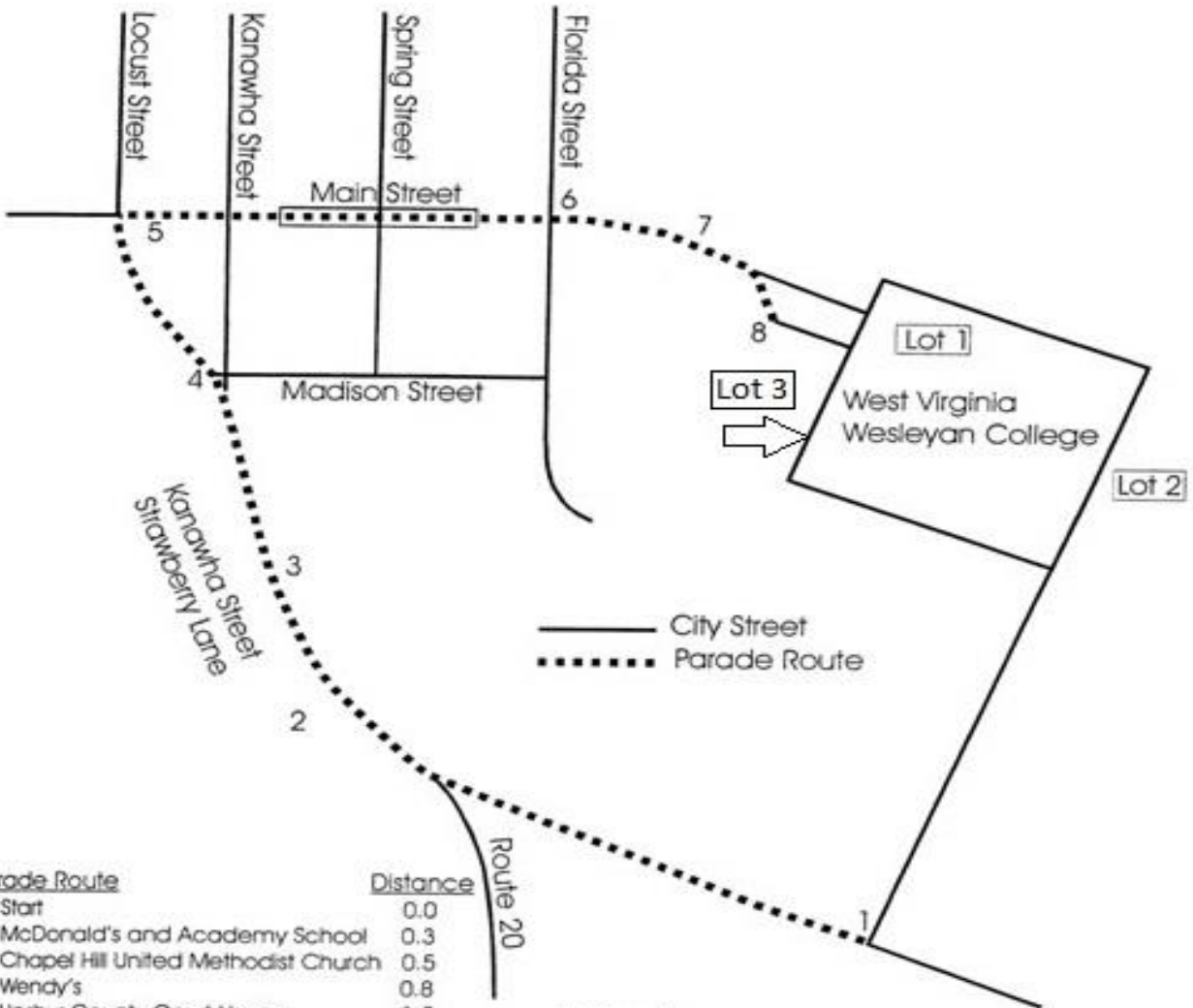
GRAND FEATURE PARADE AWARDS: The top three (3) scores in each category for Junior High / Middle School and High School will be recognized from the Grand Feature Parade on Saturday. The Grand Champion trophy will recognize the top three (3) bands as ranked by the Grand Champion Score Sheet (Page 22).

***** (Winning the Grand Champion Award does not automatically make you the WV In-State Honor Band. At the discretion of the Parade Committee, an announcement will be made by November following the previous Festival.)**

ENTRY: To participate in the Grand Feature Parade each band must submit a paper copy of the Band Participation Information Form, Band Publicity Form and a signed copy of the Festival Parade Policies Form (all found on *pages 11-14* of this Handbook). All Entry Forms and payment must be submitted by April 15th. Entry Forms submitted after this deadline will result in the group being placed in the last division of the Parade.

West Virginia Strawberry Festival High School Band Concert Competition

Date:	Friday
Time:	9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.
Location:	WV Wesleyan College
Participants:	Groups will be limited to sixteen

DEFINITION: High School Concert Band shall be considered any size group of High School student musicians performing music on wind instruments and percussion instruments and led or directed without qualifying restrictions by any person.

CLASSIFICATION: There will be three levels of competition. Class, AAA, AA, and A. If scheduling permits, a limited number of bands may enter a second unit, which may enter as a Class B unit. Class B bands are exhibition bands and may perform for comment only.

ADJUDICATION TIMES: The contest will begin at 9:00 a.m.

MUSIC: A band is required to play two selections, both to be chosen by the director of the competing organization. The difficulty of the selection should be consistent with the contest classification that the band competes within.

- Class AAA should perform selections that in the majority of the Nation's published music lists is graded "Difficult" or "Grade Level VI"
- Class AA should perform selections that in the majority of the Nation's published music lists is graded either "Medium Difficult" and "Difficult" or "Grade Level V" and "Grade Level VI"
- Class A should perform selections that in the majority of the Nation's published music lists is graded either "Medium" and "Medium Difficult" or "Grade Level IV" or "Grade Level V"
- Class B should perform selections that in the majority of the Nation's published music lists is graded either "Medium Easy, Medium, Medium Difficult, Difficult" or "Grade Level III, IV, V, VI".

The performance of a warm up selection without qualification as to difficulty will be reflected on the score sheet under "Musical Selection".



WARM UP ROOM: Each band will be allowed no more than 30 minutes in the warm up room immediately before their adjudication time. No band will be allowed to use any of their warm up time on stage. Equipment in the warm up room will include 120 chairs, 60 musician's stands and a conductor's stand.

EQUIPMENT ON STAGE: For the use of each band, available equipment will include: Conductor's podium, Conductor's stand, 60 musician's stands, 120 chairs, concert bass drum, four timpani, orchestra bells, xylophone, gong, and chimes. Each band must furnish its own sticks, mallets, beaters, and additional percussion equipment required by their repertoire and not provided as listed above.

ADJUDICATION: The WV Strawberry Festival Band Adjudication Form is to be used by Judges. A sample copy is attached. To obtain the final score for a band in competition, the score of the three judges will be averaged.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented to the bands finishing first, second, and third in Class A, AA, and AAA.

Grand Champion Trophies will be awarded to the bands attaining the highest scored in the Concert Competition regardless of Classification competed within. (Class B Bands are not eligible for awards.)

Sweepstakes Grand Champion Trophies will be awarded to the bands finishing first, second, and third place in the highest cumulative points scored in concert, jazz/stage, and field and parade competition.

Sweepstakes Grand Champion: ONLY bands competing in all four competitions are eligible for Sweepstakes Grand Champion Awards. Presentation of awards for classification winners and Grand Champion winners will be made in the Rockefeller Gymnasium immediately following the conclusion of the day's concert and jazz programs.

ENTRY FEE: A non-refundable entry of \$125.00 is to be paid and returned with your festival application. Check should be made payable to the West Virginia Strawberry Festival.

*There is no entry fee for participation in any of the three parades.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility is limited to Concert Bands from any High School accredited by its authorized state agency or accreditation organization such as the North Central Association. All bands must include the agency on the application form.

TIEBREAKER: Tied scores involving two bands eligible for awards or trophies will be broken by consultation of the Judges.

CONDUCTOR'S SCORES: Each band must provide three conductor's scores for each of the two numbers that are submitted for adjudication. Every score must have the measures numbered consecutively. These scores will be returned at the conclusion of the event along with adjudicator's score sheets, tape comments, and tabulator's recap.

ADJUDICATION TIME: Entry fee must be received before adjudication time is assigned to your band. It is to your advantage that we receive your entry fee as soon as possible.

West Virginia Strawberry Festival High School Band Jazz/Stage Competition

Participants:	Groups will be limited to sixteen

DEFINITION: High School Jazz/Stage Band shall be such as to make it a generic term to define a group of no more than 25 high school student musicians performing music on wind instruments and percussion instruments and leg or directed without qualifying restriction by any person.

CLASSIFICATION: There will be one “Open Class”. If schedule permits, a limited number of bands may enter a second unit and it will compete in “Open Class”.

ADJUDICATION TIMES: The contest will begin at 9:00 a.m.

MUSIC: Should be of high quality, festival material rated either “Medium Difficult” or “Difficult”. Your final rating will reflect, in part, the suitability of your choice of music along with its effectiveness in showcasing the various talents of your band.

ADJUDICATION PROGRAM: Shall consist of a minimum of three selections, displaying artistry in at least two contrasting styles, (more if possible). You are encouraged to play more than three **PROVIDING** you stay well within the time limit of 30 minutes to set up, perform, and leave the performance area.

EXPLANATION: Contrasting styles refer to Swing, Ballad, Latin, Rock, etc. It does not simply imply contrast in tempo, such as fast rock, slow rock, fast swing, slow swing, etc.

TIME: Each band will be on stage for thirty (30) minutes, which includes time for setting up the stage, warm-up, performance and leaving the stage.

EQUIPMENT ON STAGE: Will include: conductor’s stand, 25 musician’s stands, 25 chairs, a P.A. System with four (4) microphones and a small grand piano. Each band must furnish its own drum set, electric piano, guitar amps, sticks, mallets, beater, and additional percussion equipment required by its repertoire and not provided as listed above.



ADJUDICATION: The WV Strawberry Festival Band Adjudication Form is to be used by Judges. A sample copy is attached. To obtain the final score for a band in competition, the score of the three judges will be averaged.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented to the bands finishing first, second, and third. Trophies will be awarded to the bands with the best “Sax” section, the best “Trumpet” section, the best “Trombone” section, the best “Rhythm” section, and the best “Soloist”.

Presentation of these awards will be made in the Virginia Thomas Law Center for the Performing Arts immediately following the conclusion of the day’s concert and jazz programs.

Sweepstakes Grand Champion Trophies will be awarded to the bands finishing first, second, and third place in the highest cumulative points scored in concert, jazz/stage, field and parade competition.

Sweepstakes Grand Champion: ONLY bands competing in all four competitions are eligible for Sweepstakes Grand Champion Awards. Presentation of awards for classification winners and Grand Champion winners will be made immediately following the adjudication of the final band in the day’s program.

ENTRY FEE: A non-refundable entry of \$125.00 is to be paid and returned with your festival application. Check should be made payable to the West Virginia Strawberry Festival.

*There is no entry fee for participation in any of the three parades.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility is limited to Jazz/Stage Bands from any High School accredited by its authorized state agency or accreditation organization such as the North Central Association. All bands must include the agency on the application form.

TIEBREAKER: Tied scores involving two bands eligible for awards or trophies will be broken by consultation of the Judges.

CONDUCTOR’S SCORES: Each band must provide two conductor’s scores for each of the selections submitted for adjudication. Every score must have the measures numbered consecutively. These scores will be returned at the conclusion of the event along with adjudicator’s score sheets, tape comments, and tabulator’s recap.

ADJUDICATION TIME: Entry fee must be received before adjudication time is assigned to your band. It is to your advantage that we receive your entry fee as soon as possible.
